Domestic Violence in the Homecare Setting: Teaching Homecare Nurses About Domestic Violence

Domestic Violence affects everyone; women, children and men. It is not dictated by race, gender, sexual preference or socioeconomic status. It is about physical, emotional, mental, financial and sexual abuse. According to the Bureau of Justice statistics, a woman is beaten in the United States every 15 seconds. Additionally, 1 in 5 women will continue to be victimized by their significant other over and over again (Surgeon General). These statistics easily show the prevalence of Domestic Violence that can extend into the home setting. As homecare nurses, you have the distinct advantage to be able to get into the home and assess this situation.

As stated, Domestic Violence is a growing concern for the medical community. This presentation will focus on the homecare nurse appropriately assessing and intervening in Domestic Violence. It will include signs and symptoms of the victim once the homecare nurse enters the home, how to safely remove the victim and children from this volatile situation, and what the homecare nurse should and should not do when caring for the victim of Domestic Violence. In addition, this presentation will show how homecare nurses can empower the victim to move on with his or her life.
