

The Role of Genetics and Lifestyle in Mental Health with Homebound Seniors

Depression and other chronic mental health issues, such as bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, and anxiety disorders can be costly, disabling, and deadly. Most medical professionals have always believed that one's health and mental wellness was largely based on what your parents pass down to you genetically. These ideas have changed and researchers now say its 70% lifestyle/30% genetics. We will explore the latest research on what lifestyle changes homebound seniors can make that have been clinically shown to be effective in treating mental health issues, review the role genetics play in mental health vulnerability and the treatment strategies that have been shown effective with those isolated and homebound.

Assessment, Referral and Treatment of Depression in Older Adults

Older adult depression is a widespread phenomenon creating skyrocketing Medicare costs, increasing disability, and resulting in the highest suicide rates of any population. This silent and costly epidemic is attracting growing national attention. A review of the diagnostic criteria, how it often presents with seniors, assessment tools, and referral strategies will be discussed from a homecare perspective. Participants will be briefed on the state-wide growing efforts to reduce stigma and educate the public about senior depression as a brain disease and the programs that are effective, budget-friendly, and doable within current time constraints and aging networks.

Differentiating Depression from Delirium and Dementia in Older Adults

Aging and mental health issues complicate each other especially when frail seniors may present with one or all of the following conditions depression, dementia, and delirium. This teleconference is for homecare staff and professionals who interact often with seniors and can pick up on small mental status changes that may indicate something significant physically and/or mentally is going on. Learn about the most common symptoms, diagnoses, mis-diagnoses as well as assessment and treatment strategies to help homebound older adult clients age gracefully and happily.
